Call to order:

Charlie is looking into a fixed awning for the Food Pantry and Community Garden as well as an outdoor refrigerator.

Senator King's office sent a message informing the town that he has officially requested that the Town of Alna-Egypt Road Bridge project be funded by the Senate Committee on Appropriations. The project will be reviewed by Senators who sit on that committee. Updates or requests for further information may be sent by committee members as the process moves forward.

On 6/3/2022 the town received a FOAA request from Janis Farese, American Transparency. The request wanted an electronic copy of any and all employees for year of 2021. The record should also contain the employee's full name and gross annual wages. It is not a typical FOAA request so Charlie will check with MMA legal before acknowledging the request.

Charlie has not yet completed an update on the town website regarding General Assistance.

Toby Stockford has finished winter cleanup at the Town Office.

The vinyl siding on the office building still needs to be repaired. Jason Stodder looked at the problem and can do the job for \$600.00 or less.

The Road Committee met again. Only three were able to attend.

Roadside mowing will be on the agenda tonight.

Cross Road final edging and grading is complete.

Bills for culvert replacements have been sent out to four property owners.

Ditching on Rabbit Path Road has been completed.

Ed is working on the Tax Commitment. Ed believes that the town's finances are in very good shape.

There is an opportunity to apply for a Risk Reduction Grant. The need for additional safety fencing at the Head Tide Dam seems like an appropriate match with this grant. Linda will work on this task.

Katie and Ed are working on gathering Alna children's art/writing inputs for next year's town report.

Ed will submit the Spirit of America nomination to the website.

Maine DOT pricing for salt came in at \$75 a ton. Alna paid \$85 a ton last year. The past average for the town's salt use was 250 tons.

Charlie now has all required codes for SAM.gov. He needs to update a few things on the application in order to finally submit the application for a grant to obtain a generator for the town office.
